Hamsa

This is a healing chant for the lungs. The hamsa mantra focuses on the inhale and exhale, helping to create a vibration that connects you to your heart. It is also healing for the heart, mind and spirit. Music by Kathleen Karlsen.



Water Chant (Gange Mata)

Om Jai Gunge Mata, Sri Jai Gunge Mata (2x) Om Shuddhi Daata Gunge, Mata Namo Namah (2x)

This is a water chant to Mother Ganges, the goddess of the sacred waters. It is in the Dorian mode, a musical scale that the ancient Greeks associated with the water element. The word "shuddhi" means "purity and "data" means "to give." The mantra can be translated as, "Victory and honor to Mother Ganges who gives us purity!" Music by Kathleen Karlsen.



Shiva Ra

Hari Om, Hari Om, Shiva Ra Namo

A chant in honor of Shiva who is like "Ra," the sungod. "Hari" is a name for the supreme, the absolute god who takes away all sorrows. Music by Kathleen Karlsen.



Chant to the Sun

Om Bhaskaraya Vidmahe, Om Maha Tejaya Dimahe (2x) Om Surya Namaha, Om Surya Om (2x) Tanno Surya Prachodayat (2x)

Surya, or Bhaskaraya, the giver of wisdom and illumination, is the Hindu god of the Sun. Surya is often depicted surrounded by the physical sun, riding in a chariot pulled by seven horses representing the seven chakras. His charioteer is Aruna. The meaning is: "Let me meditate on the Sun. Let me think about the highest power. I bow before the Sun. Homage to the Sun! Let the giver of life illumine my mind." Music by Kathleen Karlsen.

Goddess of Mercy

This chant invokes the compassion of Kuan Yin. Kuan Yin is the Buddhist goddess of mercy and compassion.
